City Council Update

The Evans City Council held only one regular meeting and work session during the month of November on account of the Thanksgiving holiday. In the regular meeting held on Nov. 7, the Council did tackle a handful of issues on multiple fronts.

First and foremost the Council took the final steps to officially approve the 2024 City budget. The Council worked very closely with City Manager, Cody Sims, Finance Director, Jacque Troudt, and the other City Staff to craft the budget over the course of the last several months. As a result of their direct hand in the budget's development, it was unanimously approved at the meeting. Also at the Nov. 7 meeting, the Council addressed two separate but related agenda items that pertain to the construction of a Murphy USA gas station on the southwest corner of 37th Street and St. Vrain Street, just west of Highway 85. The two approved measures pave the way for the next steps in the development process to begin. The first step will be the demolition of the three structures currently on the property - an abandoned commercial building, a single-family residence and 85 Liquor Store.

The Council also approved a request to allow for the construction of seven additional single-family homes in the Grapevine Hollow neighborhood. The homes will be built around a cul-de-sac that has been named Sapphire Court and laid over a since-abandoned and remediated oil and gas operation; the residences will be located outside the 50-foot setback requirement from the abandoned well.

The Council also looked at some design plans for the entrances to Riverside Park. Several different concepts were presented and the Council opted for one with a modest price tag of \$70,360.

GOVERNMENT 101 - What is the City Manager's role?



In Evans' Council-Manager government, which was outlined in this space in November's issue, the City Manager serves as the CEO of the City. This position is one of only three in the entire city government that is appointed directly by the City Council, along with the City Attorney and the Municipal Court Judge.

The City Manager's responsibility is to effectively implement the City Council's goals and priorities for the community, to administer a personnel merit system with fairness to all and in a manner designed to stimulate high morale of the employees, and to recommend an annual budget to achieve City Council's vision. In working to carry out the goals and priorities set forth by the City Council, the City Manager is ultimately responsible for assuring that every ordinance and resolution passed by the Council is implemented in the most effective and efficient manner possible. The City Manager must be up-to-date on every department's workload to assure everything is going as planned. It is important that the City Manager hire a staff of experts in their respective fields so the most qualified people are in place.

In a visual example often used by political scientists, the City Manager is at the center of an hour glass, with the voters and their

elected City Council sitting on top and the City Staff residing on the lower half. The city's residents make their priorities clear to the City Council, who then set the strategic priorities for the City Manager to enact. The City Manager feeds those guidelines down to City Staff who execute their respective tasks at the operational level. Rarely, if ever, do City Council members interact directly with City Staff and vice-a-versa; the City Manger sitting in the center of the hour glass is the point person through which all directives flow from the voters and their elected representatives to the city employees.

The City Manager works with the heads of each city department and their subordinate staff to provide professional recommendations to the City Council during policy formulation and adoption. While they fill out a staff of subject matter experts for each department, the City Manager themself must be well-versed in all city functions - from engineering to parks and recreation to human resources and all things in between. To assure that the city is delivering the best possible level of service to its residents, the City Manager, in working with each department head and their staffs, have to set priorities to make the best use of tax dollars.

In recommending the annual city budget, the City Manager must take into account the needs of all city departments and how those needs align with the vision and goals established by the City Council.

After installing the cabinets during the week prior to Thanksgiving, the City then began the process of programming the cabinets with the help of a traffic control engineer to optimize traffic flow. Dismantaling cardboard boxes is an efficient use of cart space and often the only way to ensure the lid can be fully closed.




SAFETY TIP

Road and Street Improvements

In 2023, Evans is investing \$1.6 million for road maintenance and expansion projects all across the city. This figure is four-times greater than what was spent in 2020.

We know that road construction projects can be a hassle for everyone, believe us, we feel it too, but the projects are necessary to assure we have the physical infrastructure in place to support our growing City. Thanks to the 1% road tax that was approved by Evans voters in 2020, our roads and streets have undergone tremendous improvements and the City engineering team has plans to do much more. This year alone the City has completed asphalt and concrete replacement projects on 42nd Street, 49th Street, Empire Street, in the Grapevine Hollow, Ashcroft Heights, Hunter's Reserve, and North Point Neighborhoods, and along 23rd Avenue from 32nd Street to 37th Street.




