January 2024 Queen City of the Platte City Council Update



New Evans City Councilman, Christopher Delaney, is officially sworn in by Municipal Court Judge, Michael Stewart.

In their final two meetings of 2023, the Evans City Council tackled a broad array of issues in December. The City agreed to a 200 square-foot easement– basically a sale of City property to another entity for a specific use – in Village Park with Vero Broadband for the highspeed internet provider to install equipment to operate their fiberoptic network. Vero initially offered \$748 for the parcel but the Council asked for \$2,000, to which Vero agreed.

On the Dec. 19 meeting, the Council formally welcomed Christopher Delaney to the Dias as he was selected from six applicants to fill the seat in Ward 3 that was vacated in October by the resignation of former Councilwoman Amanda Castle.

The Council voted unanimously to ban camping and camping-related activities on public property. On Dec. 5, the Council approved the designs for the second filing for the Liberty Draw development which will comprise 232 single-family homes, ample park space and the requisite transportation infrastructure.

The Council also voted to confirm the 2024 meeting schedule, approved a few budget adjustments, updated the City Charter to change regular municipal elections from April to November in accordance with voterapproved Ballot Issue 2B and appointed Evans resident Michael Valdez Jr. to the City's Planning Commission.

January 2024 Queen City of the Platte GOVERNMENT 101 - City Utility Rates and Fees

Utility Bills



Beginning this month, Evans residents will see a small increase in their utility rates. In December, the City Council approved the 2024 fee schedule as recommended by the City's Water and Sewer Board and Finance Department. While the City does not like having to increase the costs of essential services for residents, the modest increases are necessary due to a number of factors.

Residents pay the City of Evans for water (potable and non-potable), wastewater, storm water and refuse collection. Small, annual rate increases are the norm for cities and towns all across America. With U.S. inflation rates higher than the historical average, municipalities have limited options beyond incremental rate increases to assure that city infrastructure remains operational at acceptable levels.

From an accounting perspective, the City holds revenue from services like water and wastewater in what are called enterprise funds, which are self-sufficient accounts that are used only for a specific purpose, such as the treatment of wastewater or the effective removal of storm water.

The utility fees charged to each home and business are deposited into each specific fund and used only to cover the costs of operating the designated service, providing for short-term and long-term maintenance and expansion needs and assuring the most efficient use of the system. This method assures that the City does not have to "backfill" the costs of providing essential services to residents with revenue from other sources, such as sales taxes.

To cover increasing costs associated with staffing, professional services and construction, the City has had to increase the base rate for water usage by \$0.75, from \$22.50 to \$23.25 per month for residents inside city limits and from \$23.50 to \$24.25 per month for residents outside city limits. The consumption rate, which is based upon gallons per month per home, will be increased by a small 3% to cover the costs of water treatment. According to calculations done by the City of Evans Finance department, the average use of 9,200 gallons per month for a single-family home will see an increase of about \$1.60. For those in Evans who use the City's non-potable water system for a portion of the year, an increase of 8.011% will be charged, a figure in line with the regional inflation rate. The average home connected to the non-potable system uses an average of 6,100 gallons per month and will thus see a modest increase of just \$1.37 per month for the non-potable water utility.

While the 8.011% inflation rate also pertains to the wastewater system, the City approved a modest 5% increase in the wastewater rates for 2024, resulting in an increase of \$2.03 for the per month base rate. For stormwater, which is charged on a per-unit basis for single family residences and a three-tiered class based upon building square footage for commercial, industrial, and multi-family residences, an increase was required to fund major maintenance needs required system wide. Single-family residences will see a \$2.33 per month increase, with higher increases for commercial, industrial, and multi-family residences.

To help residents save money on water usage, the City offers a number of water conservation programs. Check out the City's website at www.evanscolorado.gov/waterconservationhome to learn more about these programs.

For refuse collection, the City contracts with Waste Management (WM), one of the largest trash and recycling companies in the world. As part of the contract, the City of Evans collects an extra 10% on top of WM's fee to pay for City Clean-Up days. In 2024, WM's costs will increase by approximately 5% due to the Water, Sewer and Trash inflationary index. The increase felt by residents will amount to \$0.70 for the first 96-gallon cart, by \$0.22 for the second cart. For residents who opt for the trash and recycling bundle, for which WM offers a discount, the monthly rate will increase by just \$0.30, from \$18.70 to \$19.00 per month.

Important Information Regarding Utility Billing Changes



Beginning on February 16, 2024, City of Evans utility customers will be charged a transaction fee for all credit card and ACH payments used for utility bills. In the past, the City has paid the fees charged by our payment services provider but, due to a number of factors, the City is no longer financially able to take on this burden. It is important to note that these processing fees are not charged by the City but rather by our payment processing services provider. It is unfortunate we have to pass these fees onto residents but have no choice but to do so.

Therefore, beginning with your February utility bill, the fee will amount to 2.95% of the transaction amount, with a minimum of \$2.95, per credit card transaction. For payments made via ACH withdrawals directly from a personal bank account, the fee will be \$0.95 per transaction. These fees will apply to payments made both online and in person.

However, we have created a number of options for residents to avoid paying these fees on top of their monthly utility bills. Residents have the option of using their own bill pay services available through their financial institution; please be aware that these transactions can take 7 to 10 business days to process. The other options available might sound "old school" to some but they remain an easy way to avoid paying the ACH or credit card processing fees. Simply mail a personal check – don't forget to include your payment coupon and please write your account number on the check to avoid potential processing errors – to our payment processing center or directly to the City office.

You are also free to come by the City's 24-hour a day payment drop box located at Evans Community Complex, it is easy to spot the silver utility payment drop box located adjacent to the Evans Police Department entrance. If you want to come in and say hi, you can bring a personal check or cash right up to the window where one of our helpful Customer Service Unit professionals will process your payment and provide you with a receipt. Normal business hours for the City are Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.




Last week, Evans Parks staff overhauled the horseshoe pits at City Park.

Road and Street Improvements

In 2023, Evans invested \$1.6 million for road maintenance and expansion projects all across the City. This figure is four-times greater than what was spent in 2020. This year, the City completed eight new construction and four major maintenance projects, all under budget.

In the past year alone, the City completed 489 individual concrete repairs including ADA ramps, pans, inlet decks, sidewalks and curb & gutter. 216 asphalt patches of various sizes were identified and repaired in advance of overlays and chip seal treatments. 22 local roadways and 34 roadway segments were chip sealed across three subdivisions. Since the City began pavement preservation work, 439 separate road segments have now been competed since 2018.

What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.



- 2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can. 4.

Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button. Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed. ***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.



SERVICE GUIDELINES

- Do not leave any materials next to or outside your cart. Excess materials will not be collected.


