Please come join Evans Mayor Mark Clark for a community Town Hall Meeting on June 13th at the Evans Community Complex. Mayor Clark will provide an update on a number of big projects currently underway in our fair City and will also host a question and answer session for residents. This is a great opportunity for residents to interact directly with the Mayor. Event begins at 6pm and lasts about 2 hours.



On May 22, Evans Officers were contacted by Sam's Club regarding a food donation they wished to make. Upon arrival, Officers were amazed to find a pallet holding 20 cases of eggs - 5,760 in total! The Officers distributed the eggs to residents in our low-income and senior areas, as well as provided some to the Greeley Family House and Guadalupe Shelter. We want to express our thanks to Sam's Club for their generosity and continuous support of the families in our community. Over the next week, another 8,363 eggs, 34 watermelons and 3 pallets of grapes were donated and distributed throughout the community!

Evans City Councilmembers Jeff Crabtree, Chris Delaney and Tammy Mortensen were joined by members of City Staff, including City Manager, Cody Sims, at the ALLO Fiber groundbreaking ceremony at the Highplains Library on May 20th! Welcome to Evans, ALLO Fiber!

City Council Update



The month of May saw progress made on a number of fronts by the Evans City Council. At the May 7 meeting, the Council voted unanimously to partner with the consulting firm Adaapta in the administration of a \$500,000 Brownfields Assessment Grant courtesy of the EPA. The grant will help plan for revitalization efforts along Evans portion of the Highway 85 corridor. Given that the corridor has a history of industrial uses, the scope of this partnership will be to identify sites in need of remediation to conform to future uses and attract prospects for development opportunities. Additionally, Adaapta will institute a public engagement campaign that will help City identify needs of local businesses, as well as prospective business, in the area.

In the same meeting, the Council also voted unanimously to approve a contract with Martin Marietta for \$555,000 worth of asphalt reconstruction projects in three segments – 15th Avenue from 37th Street to 34th Street, 41st Street, and 41st Street Road between Belmont Avenue and 17th Avenue – as well as an additional alternate on Heather Lane that requires a full reconstruction – of the City that are in need of work. A contract for a professional, full-time inspector of the 37th Street widening project was also approved unanimously, helping ensure this major project is completed to the best possible standards.

On May 21, the Council announced the seven citizens selected to serve on the ad-hoc committee regarding the parking and storage of RVs, boats and trailers on residential property. The seven residents selected were - Lyle Achziger (at-large, by Mayor Mark Clark), Luis Chavez (Ward-1, by Mayor Pro Tem Laura Speer), Angie Armstrong (Ward 1, by Councilman Fred Neal), Charles Nailon (Ward 2, by Councilwoman Tammy Mortenson), Caroline Gelatt (Ward 2, by Councilman Jeff Crabtree), Willard Kendall (Ward 3, by Councilwoman Ally Johnson) and Mathias Dalrymple (Ward 3, by Councilman Chris Delaney). The Council was very appreciative of all the citizens who applied for the committee and are confident these seven will make very useful policy recommendations for the Council to consider when crafting a plan forward that works for all of Evans. The Council also unanimously approved a design contract with BrightView to remake Hunter's Reserve Park into a first-class outdoor space for residents to enjoy and approved a pair of mineral extraction leases with PDC Energy that will net the City 20% of the royalties earned over the next four years from the extracted minerals.

Looking ahead... In June, the City Council will consider a contracts for the installation of the traffic signal radar system - an upgrade that will help improve traffic flow in Evans by employing vastly improved technology, as well as a pair of contracts for much-needed drainage improvements at some City detention ponds and public parks. The Council is also tentatively scheduled to see some preliminary plans for the proposed Vector development on the southwest corner of 37th Street and 47th Avenue as well as consider contracts for the Ridge Park design. GOVERNMENT 101 - Parks and Recreation



One of the City Departments with which residents interact most frequently is Parks and Recreation. Parks & Rec is also one of the City departments at the forefront of achieving the City Council's goals of economic development and community beautification – by offering more park amenities, upgraded park facilities, a broad array of recreation offerings and special events such as the Easter Eggstravaganza, Holiday Lighting Ceremony, City of Evans Golf Tournament and, of course, Heritage Day – the City becomes a more attractive destination for residents and businesses alike.

Evans currently boasts 12 public parks spread throughout the City with two more – DaVinci Park (see page 4) and Hunter's Reserve Park (stay tuned!) – on the way. But it is not just the quantity of the parks that matters, but also their quality. The City has made a concerted effort to design parks that bring diverse appeal for outdoor activities to residents of all ages. Evans is proud that its park system – anchored at Riverside Park with its ample open space, four ballfields with a central concession stand and restrooms, basketball and pickleball courts and a one-of-a-kind playground and climbing wall – offers a wide range of activities for outdoor enjoyment. Several parks across the City feature playground equipment for our City's youngsters, others have basketball, tennis, and sand volleyball courts, most have shade, shelter and picnic structures for hosting get-togethers and we even have an off-leash dog park complete with the dog agility competition equipment.

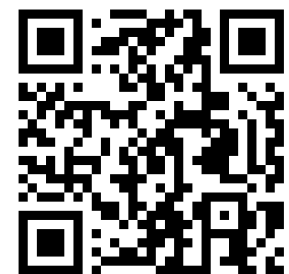
The City Council approved a design contract to remake Hunter's Reserve Park from an open field to a modern park with a small playground area, shade structures and a walking trail. The City is also currently working on improvements to the stormwater drainage at Driftwood, Prairie View and Dante Parks, with plans to get contractors hired and the work completed before the end of the summer, allowing these three parks can be fully opened for the enjoyment of our residents. On the recreation side, the City of Evans offers a full range of sports and activities offerings for everyone from elementary school aged children to active adults to our seniors. A fully equipped workout facility offers free weights, weight machines and multiple pieces of cardio equipment. The floor in the gym was resurfaced last year, with markings for basketball, volleyball and pickleball and is open year-round.

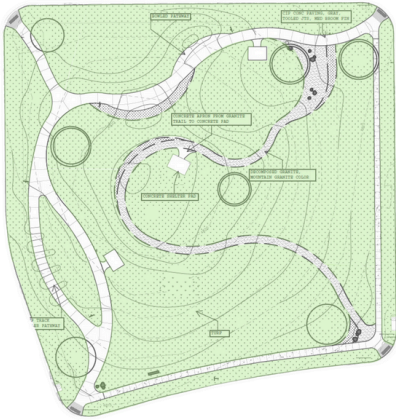

The City of Evans Parks, Recreation and Facilities Department is so excited to announce that work continues on the remodel at DaVinci Park. Over the next few months, crews will be out working on this magnificent addition to our City, so beware if you are in the area. This summer, when work is complete, we will hold a grand opening ceremony. Until then, stay tuned to the Evans Express and Evans social media for updates on construction. Below are photos of the work progression. The park is nearly complete as in the last few weeks, landscaping was installed and the sod turf was laid down. The sod will take about two weeks to take root and, during that time, we ask that people and pets refrain from stepping on the turf. Over the next couple weeks, the benches will be installed and the shade structure will be erected. We are anticipating being able to open the park this month!

Road and Street Improvements

When the warm weather came to the area, the City began working on \$1,450,000 for roadway maintenance projects which included concrete replacement work (pictured above from March in the Platte Valley neighborhood due east of Centennial Elementary School) as well as asphalt patching, asphalt surface treatment, crack seal and mill and overlay work. Over the course of the last couple months, concrete replacement and crack seal projects have been completed neighborhoods across the City. Maintenance projects like these - funded in part by the 1% road tax - serve to not only improve road conditions but are also aid pavement preservation, saving the City, and thus the taxpayers, enormous sums of money in the long run. Next Phase of 37th Street Widening Project Begins!

The next phase of the 37th Street widening project began on April 29th. This year's work will see 37th Street widened to two lanes in both directions between Sienna Avenue to Stampede Drive, beginning where the project ended last year. The roadway will be redone in its entire one-half mile stretch to a four-lane modern arterial roadway with a landscaped median irrigated with non-potable water. The project will also include some underground utility work including the lowering of some of the Atmos Energy lines and the construction of a storm sewer. During the month of May, major progress was made on aforementioned infrastructure work. It has been decided that, to assure the safety of the work crews and to create the most efficient working conditions, the roadway will remain fully closed until at the least the end of June. We ask that residents who detour through the adjacent neighborhoods be mindful of pedestrians. If anyone notices dangerous driving behavior, they are encouraged to contact the Evans Police Department at 970-339-2441.

FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS AND REMINDERS

Any firework that leaves the ground, such as bottle rockets, mortars, roman candles, etc., or that explodes or fragments, such as cherry bombs or firecrackers, are illegal in the State of Colorado.

Always have water handy and have a bucket or pail about half full of water to dispose of used fireworks.

Remain a safe distance away, spectators should keep distance from the shooter and the shooter should wear safety glasses.

Only people over the age of 12 should handle sparklers or any kind.

Never relight a "dud" firework. Instead, wait 20 minutes and then dispose of the dud in the bucket of water.

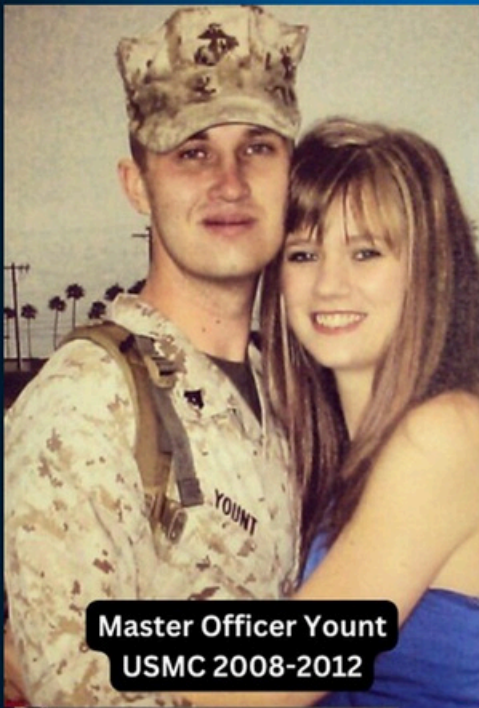
Alcohol and fireworks do not mix, the shooter should abstain from consuming alcohol prior to handing their role.

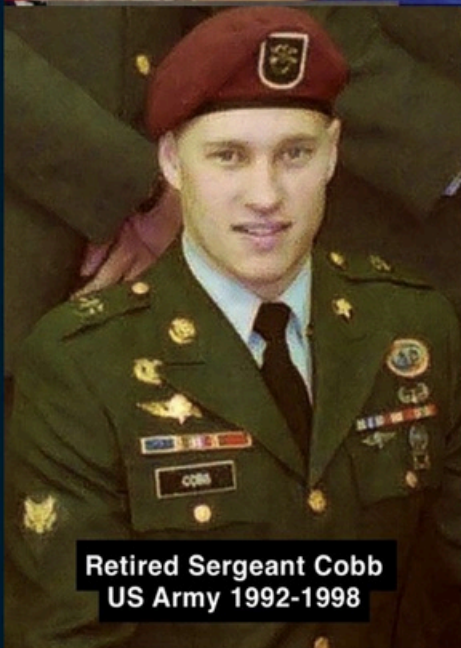

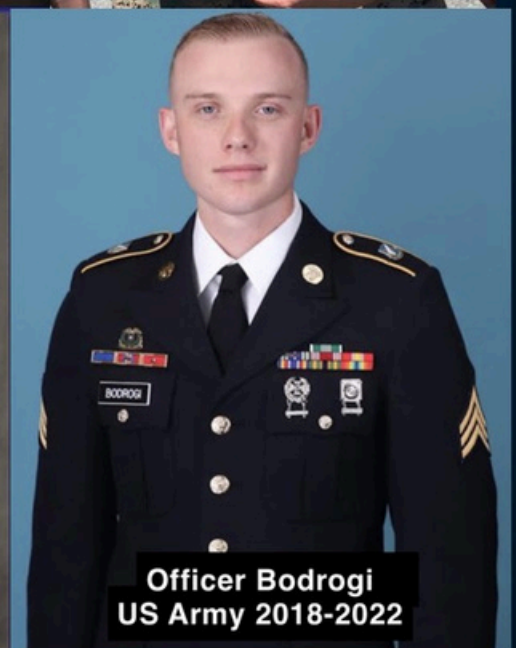

Thefts From Vehicles Increasing



The **Evans Police Department** has seen a noticeable uptick in thefts from parked cars recently. In some of the cases, the vehicles were locked, and the thieves broke into the car to remove personal items. In the majority of cases, however, the vehicles were left unlocked, allowing the thieves to simply help themselves to whatever items of value they could find in the vehicles. The most frequent types of personal items stolen include wallets, purses, car stereos, driver's licenses, insurance and registration documents, laptop computers, cell phones, license plates and garage door opener remotes which can later be used to access the home. Not only is



the theft of personal items difficult for the victim, but many of these stolen items can be used in the commission of other, often times more serious, crimes including credit card fraud and identity theft, to name a few. Criminal vehicle trespass, more commonly called car break-ins, usually occur in clusters within neighborhoods. Thieves will target a specific neighborhood one night and the next night or a few nights later, move on and hit other neighborhoods. The result is that cars parked anywhere throughout the City can become targets for theft. While this type of crime is disturbing and the Evans PD is doing all they can to prevent thefts, the good news is there are a lot of easy, common sense actions residents and their visitors can take to reduce the chances of becoming a victim.



The Evans Police Department is encouraging residents to:

- **Lock your car doors and seal your windows.** As simple as it sounds, you would be surprised how many thefts occur from vehicles left unlocked or with the windows open overnight.
- **Use all the safety features with which your vehicle is equipped.** Make sure to activate your alarm and investigate quickly if you hear your car alarm go off while you are away from it.
- **Do not leave anything of value in your car.** Leaving your purse or wallet, cell phone or laptop, your golf clubs or gym bag in plain view makes it an easy target for thieves. Even a zipped-up gym bag or backpack can be tempting for a thief as they cannot be sure if the bag contains dirty exercise clothes or something far more valuable like your bankbook, membership cards, small entertainment devices or expensive tools.
- **Park in a well-lit, secure area visible to others.** Thieves prefer to break into vehicles parked in dark and secluded areas and avoid well-lit areas as much as possible.
- **Form a neighborhood watch group.** Banding together with your neighbors helps provide cover for when you, or your neighbors, are away. See page 6 for more.
- **Report the Crime.** If you do find yourself a victim, report the crime immediately to the Evans PD.

Get the most of out of your water!

Water is a precious resource. And an expensive one. Below is a guide on how to best make use of this valuable commodity as we hit the hot and dry summer months. You can keep your lawn looking lush and green by following the guide below and using the “cycle and soak” approach. Run your system on each zone two or three times per watering day, 45 minutes to an hour apart, in order to reach the total times. For example, in June with a rotor head sprinkler, run the system for 17 minutes per zone, then, an hour later, run the system again, this time for 18 minutes to reach the recommended 35-minute watering time.



*Please note that these are recommended run times for our region, if your lawn is suffering at these recommended run times please adjust time and cycles accordingly.

The numbers above are based on watering 3 times per week. With all sprinkler types cycle and soak can help increase efficiency and reduce runoff. Run 2-3 cycles 45-60 minutes apart. The total run time for the day should equal the number recommended in the table above.

How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

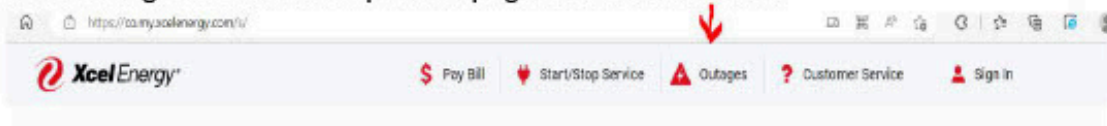

Where to report a Street light Outage?

FIRST: Select the Outages icon at the top of the page as indicated below



NEXT: Scroll to the bottom of the page and look for **Outdoor lighting Outages** and click on **REPORT AN OUTDOOR OUTAGE** as seen below



Next: Click on **Report it now** →

Finally: Enter your information.

1. Your name
2. Your email address: This is used to inform you when the light is repaired.
3. Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

1. Select the problem with the light
2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

*****Please note:** Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.
