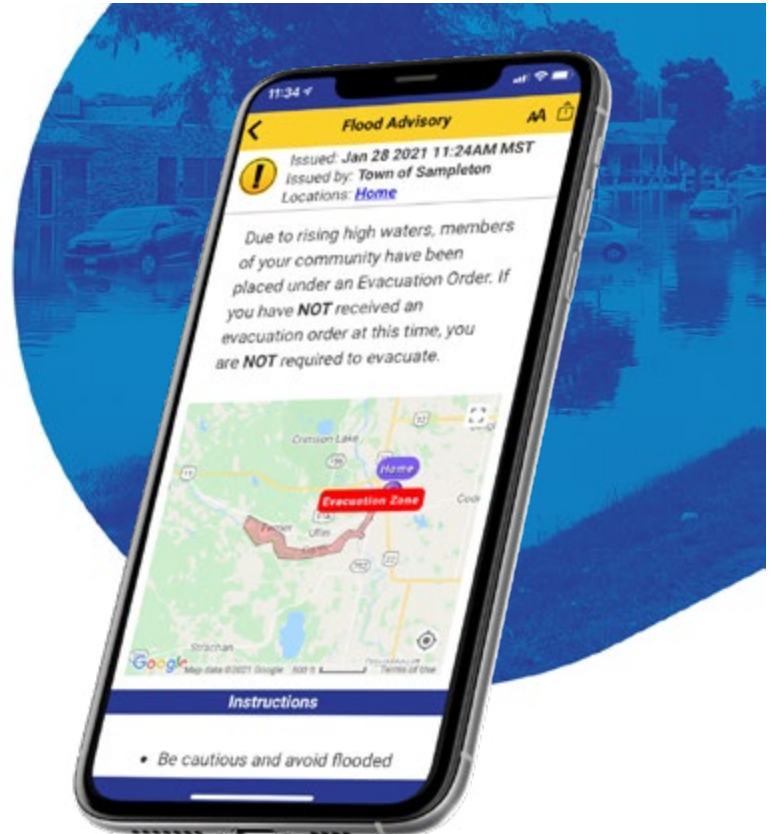

Concrete in the queue as the roundabout takes shape

"Everybody's rocking it".



That was the feeling at the 37th Street Roundabout project, where an engineer summed up the progress succinctly: "16 out of 60 days left and we're already bringing in concrete". There's a full slate of work to complete on this detailed infrastructure project, including utilities, RCP structures, and sub-grading, but through one month of work, the progress is palpable.

Warning: You'll learn a lot of cool engineering things below!

A portion of the intersection is scheduled to be completed by Friday, April 21st. Let's not get ahead of our skis: the public won't be driving on it anytime soon. There's a ton of work left to do, but concrete is scheduled to be laid next week, meaning the dug-up dirt will begin to take shape in the form of a new intersection.

We said you'll learn a lot of cool engineering things, so we'll start with selective non-destructive potholing, which has been ongoing throughout the project. What's non-destructive potholing? In short: Potholing confirms the location of buried utilities without the use of heavy equipment to excavate. Potholing involves the use of pressurized water jetting and vacuum hoses to locate buried utilities. It's fascinating!



The learning continues: subgrade Prep Grade 6 is projected to begin on Friday and the priority is the intersection. Curious what is sub-grading is? The foundation of the pavement structure is known as a subgrade. Preparation of subgrade consists of all operations before the pavement structure is placed over it and compacted. The subgrade may be situated on an embankment, by excavation, or at the existing ground surface. Three days are scheduled to deliver and place Class 6 sub-grade materials the week of April 17th.

Other news and notes: Storm sewer work is happening on the north side of the intersection and Century Link will begin lowering fiber optic lines this Friday and completing the following Monday if needed.

The end is in sight at 23rd Avenue

While 23rd Avenue has been usable for the public, it hasn't officially been completed, but Mountain Constructors should complete the splash blocks by the middle of next week. Integrated Services will begin to install landscaping. Sturgeon electric has installed the bases for the streetlights, and we estimate that the project will be complete in late May. Yay!

Drug Take Back Day deemed “A very successful event”



Drug Take Back Day was held on Saturday, April 22nd. The Evans Police Department and Evans Fire Protection District teamed up to collect 13 trash bags of unwanted and expired prescription medications from residents. Additionally, they handed out 28 boxes of Narcan. The Police called it, “A very successful event”. Narcan is available at the front desk of the Evans Police Department free of charge. Simply ask the front desk attendant and they will be happy to provide you with Narcan.

Naloxone is a medicine that rapidly reverses an opioid overdose. It is an opioid antagonist. This means that it attaches to opioid receptors and reverses and blocks the effects of other opioids. Naloxone can quickly restore normal breathing to a person if their breathing has slowed or stopped because of an opioid overdose. But, naloxone has no effect on someone who does not have opioids in their system, and it is not a treatment for opioid use disorder. Examples of opioids include heroin, fentanyl, oxycodone (OxyContin®), hydrocodone (Vicodin®), codeine, and morphine.

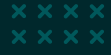
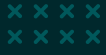
