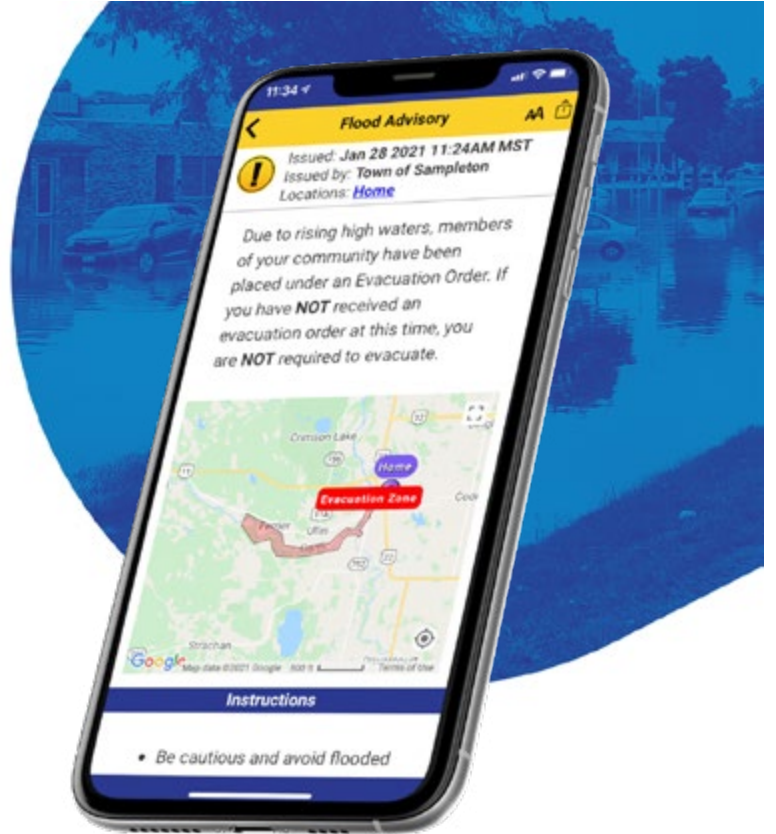

# Erosion-sediment control plan keeps 37th Street roundabout on track



The month of May brought historical rain totals to Colorado's Front Range, pouring nearly 5.5 inches of rain in Denver, meaning the 37th Street Roundabout project saw several delays. The rain caused the low-lying areas to become small lakes. Engineers 'dewatered' the wet areas, keeping Evan's first roundabout comfortably on schedule. The contractors used best management practices to keep the work site as dry as possible so work could continue.

Despite the significant rainfall, the project remains on schedule to be completed by mid-July of 2023 thanks to effective pre-planning. A tight itinerary means that contractors can't rely on cooperative weather in order to make progress. Weather delays are built into the schedule, and preparation has kept the project on track through an erosion-sediment control plan, which essentially means the crews dewatered the entire area that was deemed too saturated to work.

Before the curb and gutter, trenches, and other items took shape, detention ponds were built adjacent to the site for this exact scenario. When there's too much rain, the crews bring in trucks that reallocate massive amounts of water out of the working area and into the detention ponds.

Thanks to the dewatering efforts, concrete is now going into the site at various locations, which should expedite progress because water becomes less impactful as more cement and pavement goes in.

## June 24th-28th

**Bike racing, food trucks, and more at the Ride with a Hero event on June 24th**

There will be other activities, such as face painting and a chalk walk. Attendees are encouraged to bring an appetite, because several food trucks will be on hand with hot meals and ice cream! This fun-filled community event is free and open to the public.

### Park the car and Bike to Work on June 28th

Grab a helmet, grab a bike, and get outside for Bike to Work Day on June 28th. The City of Evans will have a bike station setup at Roasty's Coffee at 3100 11th Avenue. There's two times available, so ride through on your way to and from work. The morning shift is from 7:30-9am and the evening shift is from 4:30-6pm.

The day is designed to celebrate and encourage alternative modes of transportation. The first bike lane in Evans was striped in 2016, and Evans is becoming an increasingly bicycle friendly city. 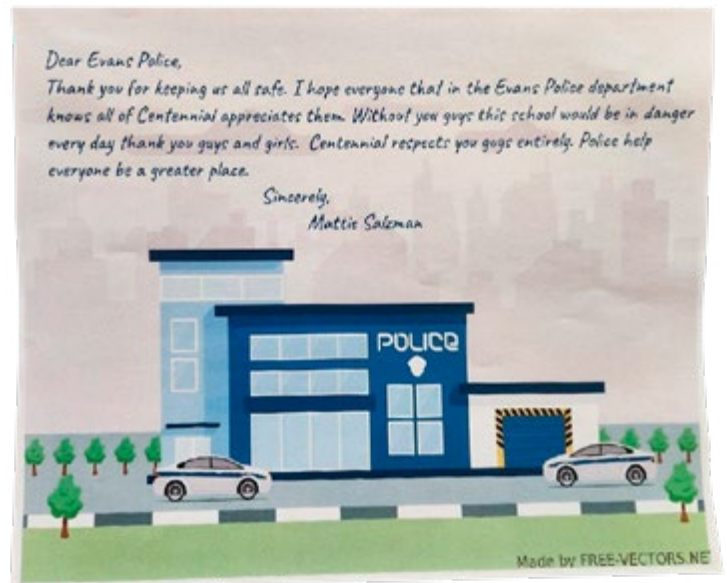
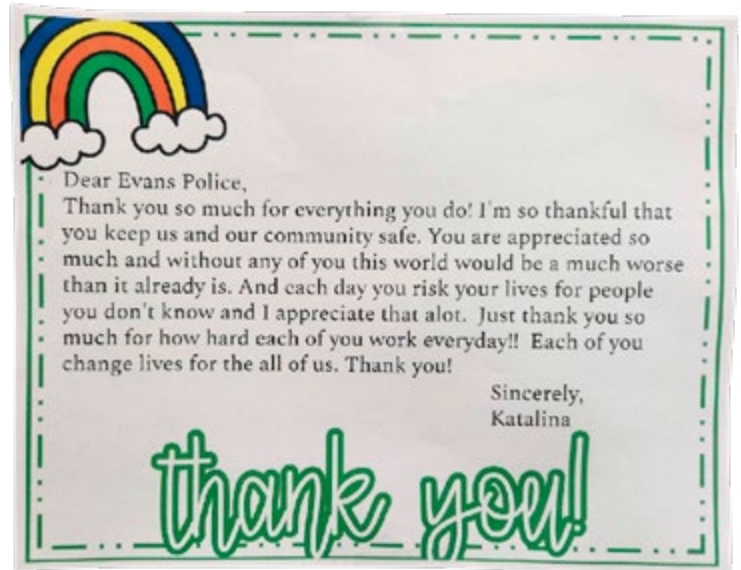
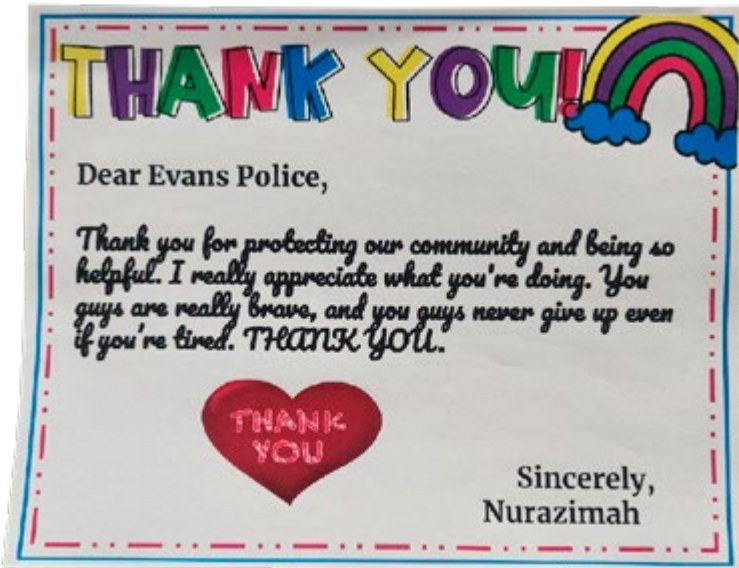




## Students Show Their Love to Evans PD

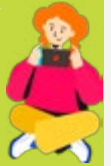

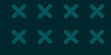
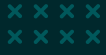
