



Thefts From Vehicles Increasing



The **Evans Police Department** has seen an increase in the number of thefts from parked cars. In many cases, the vehicles were locked, and thieves broke into the car to remove personal items. In other cases, the vehicles were left unlocked, and thieves simply helped themselves. The most frequent types of personal items stolen include wallets, purses, car stereos, driver's license, insurance and registration information, computer laptops, cell phones, license plates, and garage door openers that may be used at a later date to gain access into a home. Not only is the theft of personal items difficult for the victim, but many of these stolen items can also be used by thieves to commit other crimes such as credit card fraud, and identity theft, to name a few.

Criminal vehicle trespass, commonly referred to as car break-ins, usually occur in clusters within neighborhoods. Thieves will target a neighborhood late one evening, moving to another neighborhood on another night. The result is that cars parked anywhere throughout the city can be a target.

While this type of crime is disturbing, the good news is that there are a number of common-sense steps you can take to reduce the chances that you may become a victim of this crime.

Police encourage citizens to:



Lock your car doors. As simple as it sounds, you would be surprised at how frequently items are stolen from an unlocked car. If a thief is looking at two vehicles, one locked and the other unlocked, the thief will routinely choose the unlocked car. Securing your car by closing the windows and locking the doors can help reduce your chances of being a victim of criminal vehicle trespass.

Don't leave anything of value in your car. Leaving your purse, wallet, checkbook, computer laptop, or even your golf clubs in plain sight in your car can be an open invitation to a thief. If you must leave personal items in your car, secure them in the trunk and out of sight of the thief. Don't forget to remove your gym bag with your dirty clothes in it, or your book bag. A thief does not know what is in the bag and may be hoping to find your wallet, credit cards, checkbook, cell phone, palm pilot or other items of value. Always remove these personal items from your vehicle when you park the car for the evening.





Use safety features if you have them. Activate your car alarm, remove stereo faceplates, and use a wheel locking device if you have them.

Park in a well-lit and secure area that is visible to others. Thieves prefer to break-in to cars parked in a dark, secluded area, and will avoid well-lit areas if possible. Don't make it easier for the thief to do his work.

Form a neighborhood watch group. If you are a victim of crime, notify the police and your neighbors, and consider forming a neighborhood watch group to look out for one another. Be sure to report any suspicious or criminal behavior to the police.



Report the crime. If your car is broken into, contact Evans Police Department at 970-339-2441 to file a telephone report. An officer can be dispatched if you have information on a possible suspect or the thief left some evidence in the car.

Led Zepplin sets the soundtrack of the 37th Street roundabout project



If the 37th Street Roundabout Project had a theme song for the month of June, it would be hard to find a better soundtrack than "When the Levee Breaks" by legendary rock band Led Zepplin. Before the English rock icons remastered the song, the score was originally composed in the 1920's and was inspired by the arduous living conditions in the south following a massive flood on the Mississippi River. The song's harmonica floats atop a steady, pounding drum beat and a steely guitar riff that oozes heavy machinery and industrial tones. The ballad's muddy, locomotive rhythm is the perfect soundtrack for a construction site that's been hit with relentless rain.

Fortunately, the metaphorical levee that symbolizes a completely flooded and unworkable work area, didn't break. However, construction crews are planning long days and weekends to recoup weeks of delayed work time. To put the amount of rain Colorado has received in perspective, one meteorologist at a Denver TV station reported that the City of Denver has received more precipitation thorough June than it did in the entire year of 2022. It's great to have the moisture, but heavy doses of rainfall produce a muddy construction site, which is largely unworkable for construction crews.

Despite the setbacks, the progress is palpable, with curb and gutter and an immense amount of concrete being laid during the final week of June. Soon, asphalt will follow in strategic areas and a roundabout will begin taking shape. Hopefully, the month of July is more cooperative because if it keeps on rainin', the metaphorical levee's goin' to break.

Quick repairs reopen flooded 49th Street

While a levee didn't break during June, flooding broke the foundation of 49th Street, rendering it unsafe to drive on and the city was forced to close the road between Nevilles Crossing and 65th Avenue. The street required intensive surgery to restore it to driving condition. Crews expedited manpower and supplies to re-open the busy thoroughfare.

Emergency road repairs often require multi-agency cooperation, and in this case, fixing 49th Street included gas and waterline clearance from Atmos Energy and Greeley Water. Mountain Constructors arrived on site within an hour of the initial report and began to repair the road.

The same week that 49th Street buckled under heavy rain, 65th Avenue to Two Rivers PKWY did the same. The west Evans Street suffered a shoulder washout that was repaired quickly and re-opened to traffic safely.




