



Mayor Clark to Host Townhall Meeting Feb. 13

Evans Mayor Mark Clark will be hosting a Townhall Meeting on Thursday, Feb. 13 at 6pm at the Evans Community Complex Cottonwood Room. Mayor Clark will provide an overview of the biggest financial obstacle facing the City and some possible solutions the City is considering. The Mayor and City Council recently created a Citizens Ad-Hoc Committee to examine the finances of the City and provide feedback and advice regarding property taxes, officially known as the mill levy. Mayor Clark will also take questions from residents and light refreshments will be provided. Hope to see you there!

Evans receives a very small percentage of the overall mill levy, relative to other taxing entities.





City of Evans wins prestigious Government Finance Officers Association Distinguished Budget Presentation Award!

This marks the seventh consecutive year the City of Evans has been bestowed with this honor. "The award represents a significant achievement by the (City). It reflects the commitment of the governing body and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. In order to receive the budget award, the entity had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation. These guidelines are designed to assess how well an entity's budget serves as: a policy document, a financial plan, an operations guide, and a communications device," the GFOA said in a press release and letter to the City.



City Council Update – January 2025 The Evans City Council started off 2025 with a slew of big decisions that will have far-ranging and long-lasting impacts on

the community. The Council voted to approve contracts to begin building the new Evans Police Station, undertake major road projects on three of the City's most heavily-trafficked thoroughfares, complete the infrastructure work at the Evans Junction Property on the corner of 31st St. and Hwy 85 to prepare for a McDonalds restaurant and additional commercial development and a contract with Burnt Mountain to repair a large number of sidewalk ramps in the City to bring them into compliance with ADA standards, a project funded through the Weld County Community Development Grant Program.

Council approves 2025 major road projects.

At the Jan. 21 meeting, the Council voted unanimously to approve a contract with Martin Marietta to construct three major road projects this year: a full-depth reconstruction of 42nd St. between 23rd and 35th Aves., and mill-and-overlay projects on 23rd and 17th Aves. between 32nd and 37th Sts. This year, a new approach to road projects is being undertaken whereby several years of 1% road tax revenue is used for these larger-scale projects to provide maximum public benefit. The City had initially budgeted \$5 million for these projects but the not-to-exceed bid with Martin Marietta totaled \$4.105 million, leaving just under \$900,000 for other road projects, a win-win for Evans!





At the beginning of February, following Council approval of RockSol Consulting to serve as Construction Manager and Colorado Civil Infrastructure to serve as General Contractor, work began on the infrastructure upgrades at the Evans Junction development site located on the southwestern corner of Hwy 85 and 31st St. Work to install necessary sanitary sewer, stormwater, grading and roadwork, among more, will progress rapidly so as to allow for construction of the McDonalds to begin in May, as per the City's agreement with the developer. This work will not only allow for the McDonalds restaurant to begin erecting their location but will also pave the way, no pun intended, for other commercial developers to evaluate the site and bring more businesses to our City.

FCI Constructors selected to build new Evans Police Station

Also at the Jan. 21 meeting, the City Council voted 7-0 to approve a contract with highly-regarded FCI Constructors to serve as the Construction Manager / General Contractor for the new Evans Police Station. The Station, which will be located at 3819 Saint Vrain Street, directly south of the Evans Community Complex, will create a unified City Campus.

Groundbreaking will take place this summer.





The City Council accepted funds from the Weld County Community Development Block Grant program late in 2024 and, on Jan. 21, approved a contract with Burnt Mountain to complete the project to bring a sizable portion of our City's ADA sidewalk ramps into compliance with state and

federal standards. Construction of these ramps will begin in the near future.

After closing their Greeley brewpub in December, TightKnit has pivoted to focus on distribution, which has been successful avenue for company. But they didn't want to lose the interaction with their customers, which was one of their favorite things about their brewpub. As a result, you can visit their facility in Evans on Friday and Saturday evenings and get a behind-thescenes look at their brewing process.

Cold Weather Tips

"Puffing" is illegal in Colorado Take care of your 4-legged friends



With cold temperatures here, the Evans Police Department is reminding residents to make their vehicles a hard target for theft.

During winter months, car thieves often target "puffers," or vehicles left running and unattended as they warm up. This nickname stems from the puff of the exhaust visible during cold weather. Thieves often search for puffers because they are easy targets and then use these stolen cars to commit other crimes.

In Colorado, puffing is Class B traffic infraction. This means that in addition to being the victim of a theft, a vehicle owner can be fined for leaving their car running while unattended. The only exception to this law relates to vehicles with a remote ignition system.

The Evans Police Department is asking residents to either (1) stay with their vehicle when it's warming up or (2) use a remote start, lock the doors, and take the key with them.

According to the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA), temperatures below just 45 degrees can cause health problems for some pets.

The AVMA states, "It's a common belief that dogs and cats are more resistant than people to cold weather because of their fur, but it's untrue. Like people, cats and dogs are susceptible to frostbite and hypothermia and generally should be kept inside. Longer-haired and thick-coated dog breeds, such as huskies and other dogs bred for colder climates, are more tolerant of cold weather; but no pet should be left outside for long periods in below-freezing weather."

Other cold weather pet protection tips from the AVMA include wiping off your dogs paws, as well as their chest and belly for short-legged dogs, after walks as they could pick up dangerous de-icing chemicals from the ground. Make sure your dog has a collar and is micro-chipped as if they wander away, cold and snow can limit their sense of smell and thus their ability to potentially find their way back home if lost.



Outdoor Street Lighting How to report a Street Light Outage



What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.



- 1. Select the problem with the light
- 2. Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
- 4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.
