City Council Update



February saw a great deal of work completed by the Evans City Council. In their two meetings - the first on Feb. 6 and the second on Feb. 20 - the Council took some significant steps in continuing work on the goal of growing and diversifying the Evans economy.

The Council members received a pair of detailed updates in the Feb. 6 work session whereby the City's Community Development Department outlined that there were 442 residential and 52 commercial building permits issued in 2023 and it is expected that number of increase greatly this year as the Liberty Draw neighborhood's development picks up steam and work on the 288 apartment homes in The Reserve at Crescent Cove begins. The City's Engineering Division reported to the Council that the City's water usage was significantly below that of prior years due to the abnormally high precipitation rates of spring and early summer months.

The City Council approved the final design plans for major improvements at DaVinci Park. The Council worked hard over several months, viewing multiple concepts and offering recommendations and providing input that resulted in what was universally acknowledged as a top-notch design. (See more on DaVinci Park on page 16). The Council also approved, at the meeting on Feb. 6, a \$2,778 match to participate with neighboring municipalities to create the U.S. 34 Transportation Management Organization for planning and coordination for development and land planning work on this major thoroughfare.

The Council also unanimously approved the purchase, for \$40,000, of the non-potable water delivery system for the Tuscany neighborhood from Michael Weideman, a local farmer who was the previous owner of the system. Owning the system outright allows the City to complete maintenance work and upgrades more efficiently.

On Feb. 20, the Council was pleased to be joined by Weld County District 6 Superintendent Dr. Deirdre Pilch, who provided an update on the goings-on at the school district. While the district was pleased to announce great updates to all district school buildings thanks to the bond that was approved by voters in 2019, it was stated that it appears unlikely that Evans will see a high school built in the City in the near future.

The Council unanimously voted to approve the purchase of a Air Vacuum Excavator for the City's Public Works Department for a price of \$238,616, which was below the amount initially budgeted. This new piece of equipment will allow the Operations Division to find utilities, repair curb stops, clean out valve boxes, culverts, and meter pits more efficiently and afford City crews the ability to complete more tasks throughout the year.

The Council also, after much discussion over the last several months, voted to use \$21,000 from their discretionary funds budget to create a grant program for non-profit organizations doing impactful work in the City. Read more about this program on page 5.

As part of the Council's efforts to make Evans an ever more desirable place to do business and make a home, the City allocated \$1,450,000 across four contracts for significant road maintenance work, approving contracts for concrete replacement, asphalt patch, asphalt surface treatment and crackseal projects in neighborhoods all across the City.

GOVERNMENT 101 - Public Works









The Public Works Department is a critically important part of the Evans City Government. Public Works - which includes the City's Engineering, Water, Wastewater, Storm Water, and Streets Divisions - is responsible for all design, construction and maintenance work throughout the City.

With the Evans City Council focused on growing the Evans' economy, a wide array of projects large and small that have been planned, undertaken and completed over the last few years have all fallen under the purview of Pubic Works. When residents see the City of Evans vehicles, our pickups, our brand-new street sweeper, our dump trucks, loaders and haulers, it's a clear sign that our Pubic Works teams are out making repairs, completing upgrades and doing the necessary work to plan future projects.

Thanks to the 1% road tax approved by Evans voters, the City has been able to increase, by great than four-fold, streets maintenance and preservation work. In the 2023 alone, the City completed 489 individual concrete repairs including ADA ramps, pans, inlet decks, sidewalks and curb & gutter, 216 asphalt patches of various sizes were identified and repaired in advance of overlays and chip seal treatments. 22 local roadways and 34 roadway segments were chip sealed across three subdivisions. Since the City began pavement preservation work, 439 separate road segments have now been competed.

As was mentioned on page 2, the City Council approved \$1.45 million for more payment management projects - paid for in part through revenue generated by the 1% road tax - to be undertaken this year throughout the City. Also coming in 2024 will be phase 2A of the 37th Street expansion project. This work, which is slated to begin in April, will bring the portion of 37th Street between Sierra Avenue and Stampede Drive up to the standards of the segment directly to the west. This project will not only look great, it will help increase the flow of traffic through the City and absorb the increase in traffic the Liberty Draw development will bring.



The City's Wastewater Treatment Plant will be expanded in the future.

While roadways are important, there is a lot more work being undertaken by our Public Works Department. A major project that began early in 2024 was the expansion of the City's

Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The City has contracted with AE2S - a highly regarded design firm - to take the lead in the design work of the plant expansion project. Working alongside AE2S, City engineers will design and eventually build

a plant that can handle future growth needs through the 2040s, all the while adhering to strict environmental and public health requirements and increasing the efficiency of the system as a whole.

Throughout 2023, additional road projects were completed including the widening of 23rd Avenue between 37th Street and 42nd to bring the road up to arterial road standards complete with median landscaping, reconstruction Empire Street, the installation of the new traffic cabinets which, when coupled with the new RADAR systems (expected 2024), will greatly increase traffic flow, reduce wait times and make our streets safer.

Upgrading our roads, our WWTP, our water delivery and stormwater drainage infrastructure goes such a long way to makes Evans a better place to live for life-long residents and newcomers alike, all thanks to the planning by our City Council and hard work of our Public Works Department. Projects will continue well into the future, so stay tuned for more news!

City Council Announces Grant Program



Included in the 2024 Budget, the Evans City Council allocated \$21,000 to be used for programs or services which promote the vision and priorities of the City Council. In order to get more beneficial use of the funds, a Discretionary Funds grant program has been established to provide supplemental funding to local non-profit organizations that serve the Evans community. This program encourages organizations to continue to offer innovative services that enhance the quality of life for the citizens of Evans.

To qualify for consideration of funding, the non-profit organization does not have to be geographically located within the Evans city limits but must demonstrate the value their organization provides to Evans residents. All awarded grants shall comply with the adopted Financial Policies for the City of Evans.

For the 2024 grant funding cycle, the grant application window will open March 1st and remain open until 11:59pm MDT on March 31st.

To be considered for funding, applicants must submit a complete application package for the Discretionary Fund grant program via email kcunningham@evanscolorado.gov. Hard copies may be submitted to Customer Service/Utility Billing at Evans City Hall located at 1100 37th Street. Incomplete application packets will not be considered.

Grant recipients will be notified of the status of their funding request via email following the April 16, 2024 City Council meeting. The City of Evans reserves the right to reject any and all grant funding applications.

What you will need to report a street light outage

The Pole number where the light is located—the pole number will be on the street side of the pole and will either have two numbers over two, or three over three.

For Example



Xcel Energy relies on the information you provide so please be as specific as possible. If the pole does not have a number, then please provide the address behind the pole, or a description of where the pole is located.

For example: The light is located on the Southwest corner of E. 16th Ave and Pennsylvania.

- Contact phone number: This will be used to contact you should we have any questions regarding your repair request.

Pole information: ****If an outdoor lighting pole is broken, please call Xcel Energy Customer Care at 1-800-895-4999.

- Select the problem with the light
- Pole number: This is where you would enter the two over two or three over three numbers on the pole.
- 3. Light location: This is the Address where the light is located. Please provide as much specific information as you can.
- 4. Comments: Provide any additional information that you believe would be helpful

Lastly: You may Add more outages if there are more than one or hit the submit button.

Once you submit the request you will be provided a confirmation number. Keep this number to refer back to if needed.

***Please note: Repairs are made in 5 business days unless there is more than routine maintenance is required.


